ORDINANCE #05 of 2010

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR PARKS, AND RECREATIONAL AREAS AND OTHER FACILITIES BELONGING TO THE TOWNSHIP OF SOUTH MIDDLETON; ("TOWNSHIP FACILITIES") ASSIGNING CERTAIN AUTHORITIES AND DUTIES IN CONNECTION THEREWITH AND PROVIDING FOR ENFORCEMENT AND PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF

IT IS HEREBY ENACTED AND ORDAINED by the Board of Supervisors in and for the Township of South Middleton, Cumberland County, Pennsylvania, as follows:

SECTION 1: PURPOSE

The purpose of this Ordinance is to provide rules and regulations for the use of and conduct in all township facilities.

SECTION 2: APPLICABILITY

This Ordinance shall apply in all township facilities under the jurisdiction and/or owned by the Township, unless expressly exempted. For the issuance of permits, temporary designations, authorizations, granting of approval and other actions, the approving governing agency shall be the Board of Supervisors or its designee(s).

SECTION 3: CONSTRUCTION

In the interpretation of this and all succeeding park and recreation area Ordinances, the provision shall be construed as follows:

1. Any term in the singular shall include the plural.
2. Any term in the masculine shall include the feminine and neuter.
3. Any requirement or prohibitions of any act shall respectively extend to and include the causing and procuring, directly or indirectly, of such act.
4. No provision hereof shall make unlawful any act necessarily performed by any officer or employee of the Township in line of duty or work as such, or by any person, his agent or employees, in the proper and necessary execution of the terms of any agreement with or employment of the Board of Supervisors or Township.

SECTION 4: DEFINITIONS

The following words or phrases when used in this Ordinance shall be defined as follows:

Animals: Includes cats, dogs, horses, any fowl or birds, and any living creatures within the jurisdiction of the park area.

Approving governing agency: Means the Board of Supervisors or its designee(s).

Athletic Event: Shall include both athletic practices and competitive games.

Bridle Trail: Those paths and only the paths designated by signage where horseback riding is permitted.

Guarantor: Any person, group, club, organization or the like who, pursuant to this Ordinance is responsible to the township and/or others for compliance with this Ordinance or other governmental law or regulation. "Guarantor" includes those persons designated as "responsible party(s)" on any application for a township permit or license.

Park attendant: Any person employed by the Township or acting on behalf of the township pursuant to a contract or agreement.

Path: Any footpath, walk, underpass, bridge, or any path maintained for pedestrians.

Pedestrian: Means a person afoot.

Permit: Any written license issued by or under the authority of the Board of Supervisors or its designee permitting a special event or activity on or in a township facility.

Person: Any natural person, corporation, company, association, joint stock association, firm, co-partnership, sponsor or designated responsible person.

Recyclable Materials: Shall be those listed in the Township Ordinance governing recycling.

Responsible Party(ies): Any and all persons, groups, clubs, organizations and the like who pursuant to this Ordinance is responsible to the township, or when applicable third parties, or both.

Solicitors: Persons selling goods or services by sample or taking orders for future delivery with or without accepting advance payment for the goods. Persons seeking any form of contributions.

Stopping or standing: When prohibited means any cessation of movement of a person or vehicle, occupied or not, except when necessary to avoid conflict with pedestrians or other traffic, including horses and bicycles.

Township Facilities: Includes, but is not limited to, all township parks; all recreation areas, owned or under the control of the Township; any trail, preserve or easement; and any building or other structure located in any township park or recreation area. "Township Facility" shall be used throughout this Ordinance to mean any or all of the above.

Township Official: Elected or appointed members of the Township Board of Supervisors.

Traffic: Means pedestrians, ridden or herded animals and vehicles, either singly or together.

Trailers: Those vehicles identified as Recreational Vehicles.

Trash Receptacle: Containers used for the deposit/disposal of trash and containers used for deposit of recyclable materials.

Vehicle: Any conveyance (except baby carriages), including motor vehicles, scooter, skateboard trailers of all types, campers, tricycles, bicycles (motorized or not), sleds, sleighs, pushcarts, or vehicles propelled by other than muscular power, also any horse or horse-drawn conveyance.

Vending: Selling or trading any item or service.

SECTION 5: STRUCTURES, PLANTS, TREES, EARTH, RUBBISH

The following are declared unlawful and violations of this Ordinance are strictly prohibited in Township facilities and violators shall be subject to the fines, penalties and liability hereinafter set forth:

1. Mark, deface, disfigure, injure, tamper with or displace or remove, any buildings, bridges, tables, benches, fireplaces, railings, pavings or paving materials, water lines or other public utilities (or parts or appurtenances thereof), signs, notices or placards, whether temporary or permanent, monuments, stakes, posts or other boundary markers, or other structures or equipment, facilities or park property, or appurtenances whatsoever, either real or personal.

2. Fail to cooperate in maintaining restrooms and washrooms in a neat and sanitary condition. No person shall use the restrooms and washrooms designated for the opposite sex, unless the person is a child of tender years and needs to be accompanied by an adult to use the facility.

3. Dig or remove any soil, rock, sand, stones, trees, shrubs or plants, or other wood or materials, or make any excavation by tool, equipment, blasting or other means or agency.

4. Construct or erect any building or structure of whatever kind, whether permanent or temporary, or run or string any public service utility into, upon or across such lands, except on special written permit issued hereunder.

5. Damage, cut, carve, mark, transplant or remove any plant, or injure the bark, or pick flowers or seed of any tree or plant, dig in or otherwise disturb grass areas, or in any other way injure the natural beauty or usefulness of any area.

6. Climb any tree or walk; climb, stand or sit upon monuments, vases, planters, fountains, railings, fences, or upon any other property not designated or customarily used for such purpose.

7. Attach any rope or cable or other contrivance to any tree, fence, railing, bridge, bench or other structure.

8. Throw, discharge or otherwise place or cause to be placed in the waters, wetlands, any fountains, pond, lake, stream or other body of water in or adjacent to any township facility or any tributary, stream, storm sewer or drain flowing into same, any substance, matter or thing, liquid or solid, which will or may result in the pollution of said waters.

9. It is prohibited to take into, carry through, or put into any township facility, any rubbish, refuse, garbage or other material. Refuse and rubbish generated while using a township facility shall be deposited in receptacles so provided. Where receptacles are not provided, all such rubbish or waste shall be carried away from the park by the person responsible for its presence, and properly disposed of elsewhere.

10. All glass containers, aluminum cans and other recyclable items brought into a township facility must be deposited into appropriate recycling containers. Recyclable items must be sorted from non-recyclable items prior to disposal in receptacle.

11. Cause or permit any animal to run loose.

12. Tie or hitch an animal to any tree or plant.

13. Hunt, molest, harm, frighten, kill, trap, pursue, chase, tease, shoot or throw missiles at any animal, wildlife, reptile or bird; nor shall he remove or have in his possession the young of any wild animal, or the eggs or nest, or young of any reptile or bird. Included herein are poisonous snakes, the killing of which is prohibited by law.

14. Walk a dog, or other domestic animal, without a leash, said leash to be no longer than six feet unless the leash is retractable, functional and can bring the animal within six feet when necessary. Further, the owner or person having custody of said domestic animal shall be responsible for removal of any animal solid waste. Further, any person(s) who is accompanied by a dog or other domestic animal while on or in a township facility shall in addition to any fine or penalty shall, as hereinafter set forth, be liable for any injury to people or other domestic animal caused by the dog or animal and further shall indemnify the township as hereinafter set forth.

15. Ride a horse except on designated bridle trails. Horses shall be thoroughly broken and properly restrained, and ridden with due care, shall not be allowed to graze or go unattended, and must remain on a designated bridal trail at all times.

16. No person shall throw away or discard any match whether lit or unlit, cigar, cigarette, tobacco, paper or other material within or against any building, boat or vehicle, or under any tree or in underbrush.

SECTION 6: VEHICLES

It shall be unlawful for any person in a public park or recreation area to:

1. Drive any vehicle on any area except the paved park roads or parking areas, or such areas as may on occasion be specifically designated as temporary areas. Any damage that is caused by unauthorized activity shall be the responsibility of the driver and/or owner of the vehicle who shall be subject to the fines, penalties, liability and indemnification hereinafter set forth. As herein stated "damage" shall include, but not be limited to, the cost of restoration of all damaged areas.

2. Park a vehicle anywhere except on a designated parking area.

3. Excluding the exception for a weather event herein set forth, leave a vehicle standing or parked in established parking areas or elsewhere in the park or other township facility after the facility's hours of operation. During a weather event, and for three days thereafter, established parking areas in parks and recreation areas may be utilized for vehicular parking, other than trailers. Permitted parking at any time is at the owner's risk. The township shall not be responsible for any damage to or theft of any parked vehicle, and while parking during a weather event is permitted, the township does not guarantee maintenance of any designated parking area. This provision shall not be construed as imposing any duty upon the township, and further the township shall not be held responsible for any damage to, or theft of any parked vehicle, whether during a weather event or at any other time when parking is permitted. This section shall not apply when the Township facility is closed by the Township for Township use.

4. Leave a bicycle in a place other than a bicycle rack when such is provided and there is space available.

5. Ride a bicycle without reasonable regard to the safety of others.
6. Leave a bicycle lying on the ground or paving or set against trees, or in any place or position where other persons may trip over or be injured by them.
7. Wash any vehicle.
8. Drive or operate within the parks any bus or vehicle adapted for more than twelve passengers; any hearse, truck or tractor, or vehicle used for advertising. Buses which are used to carry visitors to township facilities, are not included in this subparagraph provided that prior permission is obtained from the township.
9. Use any township facility, including parking places, for the repairing or cleaning of any vehicle.
10. Cause or permit a vehicle in tow of another vehicle to enter a park or proceed therein, except that in a case of a breakdown a disabled vehicle may be towed to the nearest exit.
11. Operate or drive a vehicle containing any person or object projecting or hanging outside of or beyond the side or the rear thereof.

SECTION 7: FIREARMS, WEAPONS

Unless permitted by the township, it shall be unlawful for any person to discharge in any park, recreation area or other township facility:

1. Any pistol, revolver or other object upon which loaded or blank cartridges may be used. Starter pistols used in track and field events and those used in dog training are excluded from this prohibition.
2. Any rifle, shotgun, BB gun, air gun, spring gun, slingshot, bow, or other weapon in which the propelling force is gunpowder, a spring, or air.

SECTION 8: EXPLOSIVES AND FIREWORKS

It shall be unlawful for any person to:

Have in his possession or set off any fireworks in a township facility. Permits may be given by the Township for conducting properly supervised fireworks in designated park areas.

SECTION 9: ADVERTISING, ASSEMBLAGES, ENTERTAINMENT

The following are prohibited in/on township facility and violations of this Ordinance:

1. No person shall post, paint, affix, distribute, deliver, place, cast or leave about any bill, billboard, placard, ticket, handbill, circular or advertisement.

2. No person shall do any of the following without a permit, provided that no permit shall be required for any action or event sponsored by the Township.

A. Display any advertising signs or other advertising matter, provided that a sign attached to a vehicle to identify the vehicle, or a sign lawfully on a taxi or bus, is not prohibited.

B. Operate for advertising purposes any musical instrument, soundtrack or drum.

C. Hold public assemblages.

D. Conduct exhibitions.

E. Hold a parade.

SECTION 10: MERCHANDISE, SALE PROHIBITED

No person shall expose or offer for sale any article in any township facility unless permitted by the township.

SECTION 11: IGNITABLE AND COMBUSTIBLE MATERIALS

No person shall kindle, build, maintain or use a fire in any township facility.

SECTION 12: ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES, CONTROLLED DANGEROUS SUBSTANCES, ALMS, GAMBLING, SMOKING

While in a public park or recreation area, all persons shall conduct themselves in a proper and orderly manner, and in particular no person shall:

A. Bring alcoholic beverages or controlled dangerous substances, drink or use the same at any time, nor shall any person be under the influence of intoxicating liquor or a controlled dangerous substance in a park or other township facility.

B. Solicit money or contributions for any purpose, whether public or private.

C. Play any game of chance or have possession of any instrument or device for gambling.

D. Play, engage or take part in any game or competitive sport for money, or other valuable thing, without a written permit.

E. No smoking or use of tobacco products shall be permitted in any township facility.

SECTION 13: MISCELLANEOUS CONDUCT

It shall be unlawful for any person in a park or other township facility to:

A. Camp or stay overnight in any township facility.

B. Rollerskate or use skateboards in any township facility.

C. Enter an area posted as "closed to the public."

D. Engage in threatening, abusive, insulting or indecent language, or engage in any disorderly conduct or behavior tending to breach the public peace.

E. Fail to produce and exhibit any permit he claims to have, upon request of any authorized person who shall desire to inspect the same for the purpose of enforcing compliance with any Ordinance or rule.

F. Disturb or interfere unreasonably with any person or party occupying any permitted area or participating in any authorized activity.

G. Erect or occupy any tent, stand or other structure in any park or playground, or sell or give away from any such tent, stand or other structure any food, drink or other thing, without a permit or express written permission from the Township.

SECTION 14: PICNIC AREAS

It shall be unlawful for any person or group of persons to hold a picnic in any township facility, except in areas set aside or specifically designated as picnic areas. A permit from the Board of Supervisors or Township Manager, or authorized designee must be secured for any picnic with more than twenty participants.

SECTION 15: CLOSING HOURS

No person shall be in any park or on any trail during the hours the township facility is closed. All parks are closed from sundown to sunrise, except athletic areas specially lighted for evening use which shall close at 11:00 PM, prevailing time. Closing hours will be posted at all parks.

SECTION 16: PERMITS

A. Permits for events in or on any township facility shall be obtained by application to the approving Board of Supervisors or its designee, in accordance with the following procedure:

In addition to paying all township fees:

1. A person seeking issuance of a permit hereunder shall file an application stating:

- a. The name and address of the applicant.
- b. The name and address of the person, persons, corporation or association sponsoring the activity, if any.
- c. The day and hours for which the permit is desired.
- d. The park or portion thereof for which the permit is desired.
- e. Any other information reasonably necessary to a determination as to whether a permit should be issued hereunder.
- f. Variances required from the rules and regulations pertaining to Township facilities AND other applicable Rules and Regulations.
- g. The names and addresses of at least two (2) individuals who, together with the permittee, sponsor, club or group shall be considered and held to be guarantors under this Ordinance, shall in addition to other requirements and obligations herein set forth, (1) be responsible for compliance with and when required or ordered to do so by an authorized individual, enforce the township rules and regulations, (2) responsible for cleanup of the township facility; (3) responsible for payment of any damages to person or property and including but not limited to township or others using the township facility; and (4) subject to any and all fines, penalties, liabilities and indemnification herein set forth.
- h. Name and address of company or entity providing insurance of the group or event.
- i. The number of participants in or attending the event.
- j. List all activities which are contemplated, only those listed will be permitted.

2. Standards for issuance of a use permit shall include the following:

a. That the proposed activity or use of the park will not unreasonably interfere with or detract from the general public's enjoyment of the park.

b. That the proposed activity or uses that are reasonably anticipated will not include violence, crime or disorderly conduct.

c. That the proposed activity or use will not unreasonably interfere with or detract from the promotion of public health, welfare, safety and recreation.

d. That the proposed activity will not entail extraordinary or burdensome expense or special supervision by the Township.

e. That the facilities desired have not been reserved for other use on the date and hour requested in the application.

f. The ability to pay all fees.

B. A permittee and all guarantors shall be bound by all township rules and regulations, and all applicable Ordinances, as though the same were inserted in said permits. Permittee and all guarantors are and shall be responsible for those attending the event, and are and shall be responsible for the enforcement of all township requirements.

C. An applicant for a permit shall be required to submit evidence of liability insurance covering the event, the township, those in attendance and members of the general public for injury to person or property. Coverage shall be in such amounts as may be, from time to time, determined by the township, prior to the commencement of any activity or issuance of any permit.

D. Revocation. The Township shall have the authority to revoke a permit upon a finding of violation of any rule or Ordinance, or upon good cause shown.

SECTION 17: FEES

A. Fee schedules for permits and other uses of township facilities shall be promulgated by the Township Board of Supervisors from time to time upon recommendation by the Parks and Recreation Board.

B. The Township shall have the authority to charge a fee for any damage done either willfully or accidentally by person(s) using any township facility.

SECTION 18: ENFORCEMENT

1. Enforcement and compliance with the rules, regulations, prohibitions and violations of this Ordinance may be enforced by any township official, employee, or other township designee;
2. Failure to comply with this Ordinance as well as a failure to comply with instructions from any of the above mentioned persons, shall subject the person(s) and/or guarantors to the fines, penalties, liability and indemnity provisions of this Ordinance.
3. Individuals, other than those herein designated, may only enforce the provisions of this Ordinance by presenting to the township proof of a violation of the ordinance. Said proof shall be sufficient to bring the violator(s) or guarantors before the Court of competent jurisdiction.

SECTION 19: FINES, PENALTIES AND LIABILITY

1. In exchange for the use of a township facility, and as a condition for granting the permit, the permittee(s), guarantors and/or individuals shall be jointly and severally and individually responsible for all fines, penalties and shall be liable for damage to any person or any property arising from or associated with the permitted event and/or activity, and further shall be obligated to indemnify the township when necessary.

A. FINES:

1. In addition to any penalty and liability herein set forth, violations of any township rule/regulation; this Ordinance and/or any condition, prohibition, restriction or other limitation upon which the permit was issued shall be subject to, upon conviction, a fine of not less than \$300 or more than \$500 as well as all legal fees and costs of prosecution.
2. The minimum and maximum fine set forth in 19(A)(1) shall be doubled each time a township official requests that any activity, conduct or other prohibited action cease but the activity, conduct or prohibition action continues.
3. Each violation of this Ordinance and/or any condition, prohibition, restriction or other limitation on the permit shall be considered a separate violation, each subject to the fines set forth herein.
4. Violations of state or federal law or regulations shall be punishable as set forth in the law or regulation being violated, or as determined by those authorized to enforce the law or regulation.

B. PENALTIES:

In addition to any fines or liability as set forth herein, permittees, guarantors and/or individuals shall further be subject to the township for the following:

1. Any and all damage to township property.
2. Any and all costs or losses sustained or incurred by the township arising from or associated with the permitted event including but not limited to cost of labor, fees, and all other incidental or consequential costs or losses.
3. Any group, sponsor, permittee, other responsible person or guarantor who violates:
 - i. This Ordinance or any limitation, restriction, prohibition, or condition of the permit;
 - ii. Any state or federal law or regulation or;
 - iii. Any township rule, regulation, or policy of the township.
 - iv. Shall forfeit any entitlement, right, or claim, whether real or perceived, to any future use of township facilities, and further shall have no claim against the township, its officials, employees and designees for failure to issue a permit in the future.

C. LIABILITY:

1. In addition to any fine(s) or penalty that was or could be assessed or levied, permittees, sponsors, organizations, and those designated as responsible parties shall be liable individually, jointly and severally for any and all injury, damage to person or property arising from and/or in connection with the permitted event.
2. Persons who are found to be in violation of this Ordinance, township regulations and/or state or federal law shall also be liable individually, jointly and severally together with the guarantors.
3. Persons who are found to be in violation of this Ordinance, township regulations, and/or state or federal law shall be liable for any injury/damage to person or property arising from and/or associated with the conduct/activity which was in violation of this or other township Ordinance or regulation and/or other applicable law or regulations.
4. When a violation under this Ordinance results in injury or damage to person or property, as further consideration for the use of township facilities, guarantors, responsible party(ies), and/or individuals agree to indemnify and hold the

township harmless from any claim, law suit, judgment, award, verdict or the like. In addition, the indemnity herein set forth shall include any and all costs, fees, expenses and all other payments or expenditures made by the township. Said indemnity shall also include the value of any labor or other service required from or provided by the township.

SECTION 20: EFFECTIVE DATE

This Ordinance shall become effective immediately following adoption by the governing body of the township.

SECTION 21: SEVERABILITY

In the event that any provision, section, sentence, clause or part of this Ordinance shall be held to be invalid, such invalidity shall not affect or impair any remaining provision, section, sentence, clause or part of this Ordinance or other Ordinances affected by this Ordinance, it being the intent of this Board of Township Supervisors that such remainder shall be and shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 22: REPEALER

All other Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent herewith shall be and the same are hereby repealed.

SECTION 23: DELEGATION OF DUTIES

The Board of Supervisors is responsible for making all policy decisions and approving associated fees for all Township facilities and activities. The staff will carry out the daily activities of the Township as directed by the Board of Supervisors or the township manager or assistant manager, whichever the case may be. The Parks and Recreation Board shall only have the authority, and shall have only those duties as may be, from time to time, delegated by the Board of Supervisors. Any activity of the staff, or action of the Parks and Recreation Board, beyond those approved by the Board of Supervisors, must be referred to and approved by the Board of Supervisors. Matters referred to the Board of Supervisors shall be accompanied by recommendation and/or comments from the Parks and Recreation Board and staff.

SECTION 24: ADDITIONAL REGULATIONS FOR USE OF ATHLETIC FIELDS

South Middleton Township is committed to providing quality park facilities for the benefit of its residents. This includes use of athletic fields. The governing body of South Middleton Township believes that specific regulations/restrictions must be placed on the use of athletic fields for safety reasons as well as maintaining the quality of athletic fields. The governing body believes that over use and abuse of the Township athletic fields may result in turf decline and safety hazards that would ultimately force the township to close its athletic fields. It is the responsibility of each specific athletic

association, or coach, to inspect the fields for "playability," as hereinafter described make the decision as to whether an athletic contest should continue, and to provide the parent organization (for example: CPYSL) of the township's conditions set forth herein for use of the athletic fields. The term "athletic event" shall include both contests and practice events.

If any of the following conditions exist, the athletic association and coach shall cancel the scheduled athletic event and to affirmatively prevent use of the athletic field.

1. When soil moisture is so high that there is standing water or muddy conditions exist. In addition, use of the field is prohibited when standing water or mud exist in any high traffic area such as goal mounts, base areas, and/or base paths.

2. When turf is saturated to such a level that activities on the field would cause thinning of the turf, damage to the root structure, create divets which may dry causing an uneven surface, or cause further damage to already worn areas. This determination shall be made pursuant to the guidelines hereinafter set forth.

3. When frost is on the field, the athletic event must be delayed until the frost is disappeared. If delay is not possible, the athletic event must be cancelled.

4. In drought conditions when the turf on 50% of the playing surface has turned dormant, athletic events are prohibited and must be cancelled.

5. Regulations specific to baseball and softball infields:

a. Under no circumstances shall infields that have standing water or puddles be brushed off with a broom or squeegees. A game must be postponed when stepping onto the field the turf moves or a divet is created by walking on the turf.

6. In addition to the other restrictions and prohibitions set forth herein, the following activities are prohibited:

a. Destruction of property or removal or tampering with any vegetation.

b. Cooking with charcoal or gas grills on grass areas.

c. Benches and bleachers shall not be moved or relocated.

d. Equipment, including soccer goals and flags, should be removed from the field and placed in the designated area, or maintained by the responsible person.

e. Use of the facilities in the face of signs indicating "field closed," "keep off the grass," or such other restrictive signage shall be in addition to the obligations to test field conditions hereinbefore set forth.

f. Additional guidelines for determining field condition.

i. Under no circumstances shall the athletic event take place in the presence of standing water on any area of the field of play.

ii. Under no circumstances shall the athletic event continue when walking on the turf causes water to surface.


iii. The athletic event shall not continue under any circumstances when indentations on the turf occur from walking on your heels.

iv. Regardless of the appearance of field conditions, no athletic events shall take place when one inch or more of rain was received in the 24-hour period of time preceding the scheduled athletic event. Further, when there is a steady rain on the day of the athletic event.


7. Failure to abide by the restrictions, guidelines and other requirements of this Ordinance shall result in the athletic association losing the right to use any athletic field owned or under the control of the township. In addition, in the event of violations of this Ordinance, other than those set forth in Section 23, the fines, penalties, liability and indemnification provisions of this Ordinance shall apply. In such case the definition of "guarantor" shall include the athletic association authorized to use the township facilities.


