ORDINANCE NO. 73-02

AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO DISORDERLY CONDUCT BY PROVIDING FOR CERTAIN ACTS INCLUDING LOITERING; PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF.

IT IS HEREBY ENACTED AND ORDAINED by the Board of Supervisors of South Middleton Township, Cumberland County, Pennsylvania, as follows:

SECTION I: Any person within the limits of the Township of South Middleton who shall be drunk or disorderly; or any person throwing or using stones or any other kind of weapon, object or instrument tending to do bodily injury; or any person who may be guilty of a breach of the peace, vagrancy, riotousness or disorderly conduct or drunkenness; or who shall publicly make use of obscene or indecent language; or who shall loaf or loiter or congregate upon any of the public streets, alleys or public grounds, to the annoyance of peaceable residents nearby or traveling upon any street, alley or public grounds, or being lawfully upon any of the public grounds; or any person who may be engaged in the commission of any unlawful act tending to disturb the peace, or to imperil the personal security or endanger the property of any of the citizens of the said Township, shall and may, without warrant and upon view, be arrested by the Police Officers of said Township, and committed to the County Prison, pending a hearing before any District Justice for South Middleton Township. Persons so arrested shall be entitled to give bail for their appearance according to the practice in cases of summary convictions.

SECTION II: Any person or persons violating any one of the provisions of this Ordinance shall upon conviction thereof before any District Justice for South Middleton Township, be punished by fine of not less than Five (\$5.00) Dollars, nor more than Twenty Five (\$25.00) Dollars, together with costs of prosecution, and in default of payment thereof, be committed to and imprisoned in the County Prison for a period not exceeding thirty (30) days. All penalties imposed for the violation of this Ordinance shall be paid to the Township Treasurer for the use of the Township.

SECTION III: The provisions of this Ordinance shall be serviceable, and if any of its provisions shall be held to be unconstitutional, illegal or invalid, such decision shall not affect the validity of any of the remaining provisions of this Ordinance. It is hereby declared as a legislative intent that this Ordinance would have been adopted had such unconstitutional, illegal or invalid provision not have been included herein.
